Horse Show Management reserves the right to refuse, accept conditionally or to cancel any entries, disqualify riders or exhibitors, prohibit exhibition of entries and cancel award prizes, without claim for damages; to change any course, to cancel or combine any unfilled classes, or to reschedule classes, after due notice to exhibitors; to change rings or rotate or change judges and officials; to change specifications in jumper classes in order to facilitate the time schedule. Management reserves the right to combine or cancel. Management reserves the right to limit entries in a class. Refused entries will be returned.

ASSUMPTION OF RISK: By signing the entry blank, the Owner, Lessee, Trainer, Manager, Agent, Coach, Driver, Rider, Handler, Vaulter or Loungeur acknowledges that horseback riding, particularly jumping, is a dangerous activity and involves inherent risks that may cause serious injury and in some cases death because of the unpredictable nature and irrational behavior of horses, regardless of their training and past performance and expressly assumes all such inherent risks whether identified herein, in the entry blank, or in the Federation Rules and Regulations. A horse, without warning or any apparent cause, can buck, stumble. fall, rear, bite, kick, run, make unpredictable movements, spook, jump obstacles, step on a person's foot or push a person-all of which may cause the rider or observer to fall or be jolted, resulting in serious injury or death. A horse may also become loose and cause injury to an observer or rider or to another horse-a loose horse can run at full gallop in a panic and run into objects or persons or other horses. The Show Ground Facilities are bordered by highways/roads and thus noise from traffic and other sources occurs that can and will cause a horse to unexpectedly spook or react quickly. The Show Ground Facilities contain roads or driveways that are traversed by cars, golf carts, tractors, trailers and heavy equipment all of which may spook a horse. The above warnings and risks are meant as an example of some of the risks that are inherent and may be encountered

but it is agreed this is not an exhaustive list and there are numerous additional conditions and/or events that may result in injuries while participating in the Competition and/or being present on the Show Ground Facility.

## THE FOLLOWING IS REQUIRED FOR EACH ENTRY:

A. All horses on grounds must be registered on an entry blank including horses not entered in classes. One entry blank per horse.
B. Entry forms must be complete with owner, riders, trainers and payee information including association membership numbers.
C. Date of Birth of all minor exhibitors.
D. Signatures of owner, riders, trainer and parent or guardian of minor exhibitors. Parents or guardians of minor exhibitors shall hold the Horse Show, West Palms Event Management, Inc., Murieta Equestrian Center and staff harmless for injury to such minor(s).
E. Entries must be submitted electronically through showgroundslive.com.
F. For all horses include Nomination and Stall Fees as a deposit. Make checks payable to West Palms Event Management or complete the credit card information through your showgroundslive account.

Accounts must be closed at the end of each show week. Management will close Exhibitor Accounts that have not been settled at the conclusion of each show. Back numbers will not be issued until previous week balances are closed. Exhibitors must close out their account online through ShowGroundsLive. Exhibitors who do not close out by the Monday following each show automatically authorize WPEM to close their account using the Credit Card on file. Billing questions or refunds will not be considered after two weeks following the conclusion of the show. Should you have any questions or concerns with your bill, please email the horse show office directly. The Horse Show policies herein stated regarding scratches and refunds will be followed regardless of weather and in place of GR 912 . Receipt of any entry form to WPEM, whether bearing signature or not, will constitute an entry and will be subject to the Rules and Regulations of this prize list.

DAMAGE: Owners and exhibitors shall be held responsible for damage caused by them, their agents or employees to stalls, buildings and other properties on the show grounds, and shall be billed accordingly.

ADHERENCE TO THE RULES: All individuals on the horse park property are required to adhere to the rules mentioned in the prize list or as directed by the employees at the horse park. Trainers are all responsible for employees adhering to the rules. Violations will result in expulsion from the horse park.

PAYMENT: An open check or credit card is required at time of check in before numbers will be issued. See 6F for deposit information. A 3\% credit card fee will be applied to all credit card transactions and is nonrefundable once the card has been processed.

REFUNDS: Request for a refund of the deposit must be in writing and received before the closing date of entries and a $\$ 35.00$ fee will be deducted. The nomination and stall fees are not refundable under any condition after the close of entries. Credit Card fees are nonrefundable at any time after the card has been processed.

POST ENTRIES: Entries received with payment after entries are due will pay a $\$ 100.00$ late fee per show.

TRAINER SPLITS: WPEM allows trainers to split the show charges for miscellaneous items to their clients. Splits will be accepted until noon on the Friday of a show week. No exceptions will be made. Only items billed by the horse show directly can be split. Splits will revert back to the trainer for payment if uncollected.

ADDS/SCRATCHES: All adds must be made by $4: 00 \mathrm{pm}$ the day prior to each class. No entries will be accepted for a class scheduled on the same day.

In the unusual case the time schedule allows a management approved add the day of a class, the entry fee will be double. Horses and riders who go in a class without entering will pay a fee of $\$ 50.00$. All scratches must be received in the show office before the start of the class in writing to be considered for a refund; scratches via phone call or at the gate will NOT be considered. In divisions that are entered by complete section, no refund will be considered if the horse shows in any class of the division. The only other refunds given will be for cancellation of a class by Management, overpayment of fees, or the rejection of entries because of ineligibility or lack of stall space.

RAIN: In the event of rain prior to the Show, it is the riders' responsibility to call Show Management to determine whether the show is canceled.

RESPONSIBILITY OF PAYMENT OF SERVICES AND SUPPLIES: All owners and exhibitors will be held responsible for any damage incurred by them, their animals, agents, or employees, to stalls, buildings and other properties on the Show grounds and shall be billed accordingly. All bills for veterinary, farrier services and feed/bedding are due and payable during the Show. Management reserves the right to deduct any unpaid veterinary, farrier and feed/bedding bills from premium money due the exhibitor. Any exhibitor not meeting his obligations to the official Show Veterinarian, farrier and feed/ bedding vendor will be termed an undesirable exhibitor and entries from that exhibitor may not be accepted at subsequent shows.

RETURNED CHECKS/CHARGEBACKS ON CREDIT CARD CHARGES: Checks returned by the bank or Credit card chargebacks for any reason are regarded as a most serious offense and will be handled according to the following procedure: A $\$ 50$ penalty will be assessed for each returned check or chargeback OR 10\% of the face value of the check or chargeback, whichever is greater. Accounts will be given ten (10) days to be paid in full with cash or cash equivalent or they will be reported to the U.S. Equestrian Federation, Inc., PCHA and other appropriate association(s) for further disciplinary action. Checks will not be deposited a second time. In the case that the debt is not cleared within 30 days of the conclusion of the show, all prize money will be forfeited.

UNPAID CHARGES: Any exhibitor leaving the show with an unpaid balance will be billed for these charges and a $\$ 50$ billing fee will be added to the total due. Until these charges are settled, all further entries of rider and owner will be returned.

SAFETY REGULATIONS: Unauthorized use of the light fixtures will result in removal of your appliance. Smoking or open flame devices are not permitted within the stables. Keep flammable decorations to a minimum. Electrical outlets are provided.

CLOSED RINGS: Horses are not permitted in any ring where a course is set unless otherwise given permission from management, or when there is equipment in the ring. Please check with the show office for information regarding schooling policies. Horses and riders must yield immediately for watering and dragging. Violations of the above mentioned rules may be considered cause for elimination from the show.

RING INFORMATION: In all jumper classes, competitors will be given fortyfive (45) seconds to cross the start line. All show and warm-up arenas consist of sand/fiber footing. Jumper Rings 130' X 250', 130' X 220', Hunter Rings 100' X 230', 120'X 230'.

STABLING: Permanent Premium Stalls and tack rooms will be available for $\$ 400.00,10^{\prime} \times 12^{\prime}$ and $10^{\prime} \times 10^{\prime}$ with top and bottom doors and dirt flooring. Hauling in is allowed at $\$ 75.00$ per horse per day. No bedding included. Water buckets and hoses must be provided by the exhibitor. NO straw or synthetic/paper materials permitted- only wood shavings. It is strictly

forbidden to remove stall doors. Exhibitors will be billed for any damage to property. IF YOU LEAVE ANYTHING BEHIND IN THE STABLE AREA, YOU WILL BE BILLED A MINIMUM OF \$500. IF YOU LEAVE SYRINGES ANYWHERE OTHER THAN THE RECEPTACLES PROVIDED YOU WILL BE BILLED \$500 PER SYRINGE. THIS WILL BE STRICTLY ENFORCED.

Curfew and quiet times must be observed between 9 pm and 5 am (as required by GR1215.3 \#033-22)

HORSE IDENTIFICATION: Horses are now required to have a back number attached to their neck or their rider when outside of their barn/tent (as per HJ106.2 \#247-22).

ROLEX/USEF RANKING LIST: Please reference www.ryegate.com for the current ROLEX/USEF Show Jumping Ranking list and competitions to count.

FEED AND BEDDING: Pre-orders and onsite orders must be submitted through www.westpalmsevents.com. (online order form) Orders must be made by NOON. each day for same-day delivery through the website.

SCHOOLING SUPERVISION: Gate Stewards are schooling supervisors and have absolute authority to scratch riders who do not follow USEF, FEI or appropriate association schooling rules.

NUMBERS: Management will provide a number card for each competitor which shall be worn clearly visible to the judge at all times when in competition. Riders wearing the wrong number or no number at all MAY be eliminated from the class by the judges.

DOGS: Dogs and other pets must be on leashes at all times. A $\$ 100$ fine will be charged for all loose dogs.

VACCINATION INFORMATION: Beginning December 1, 2015, all horses entering the grounds of a Federation- licensed competition must be accompanied by documentation of Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhinopneumonitis) vaccinations within six months prior to entering the stables. The management in consultation with respected veterinarians and local animal health authorities strongly recommend and urge that all horses attending the show follow a two-part West Nile vaccination protocol consisting of a primary vaccination, followed by a booster $3-6$ weeks later. Should you have any questions please contact the CDFA.

EQUINE HEALTH REQUIREMENTS: Equine Health Requirements will be enforced. All horses (competing or not) that enter the grounds are required to present the Required Health Entry Requirements, including the Event Participation Declaration and Proof of Vaccination. All horses are subject to examination by WPEM officials/designated representatives and/or state officials (collectively "officials") for determining whether such animals are, have been infected/exposed, or are likely to become infected with an infectious or contagious disease. If after such examination, officials have reason to believe that an animal's health condition places other animals at risk, such officials, at their sole discretion, may quarantine such animal (and others that may have been infected/exposed) or, if appropriate, require that such animals be transported off the grounds. All participants agree to fully cooperate with event officials and abide by their decisions and instructions. Failure to comply shall be grounds for immediate expulsion and potential disciplinary action by organization, state/local or federal animal health officials. All exhibitors are encouraged to review the equine health entry/transport requirements of the destination state prior to entry. Additional information can be obtained from the State Vet Office. Please refer to the www.westpalmsevents.com and the show office for current Equine Health and Biosecurity measures.
ARRIVAL AND DEPARTURE: Sacramento Spring Classic 1: Stalls will be
available at 11:00 am on Monday, March 25. All stalls must be vacated by Saturday, March 30 unless staying for the second week. Sacramento Spring Classic 2: Stalls will be available at noon on Monday, April 1. All stalls must be vacated by Saturday, April 7.

PROTEST: Any USEF member lodging a protest must first deposit $\$ 200$ (nonmembers \$300) payable to West Palms Event Management with the Show Secretary, which sum shall be forfeited to the Horse Show, if the same is not sustained. All protests must be in writing, signed by the protester and filed within 48 hours of the occurrence of the alleged violation. A protest may be filed with the Show Manager, the Federation Hearing committee or Show Secretary. If the protest is sustained, the entries standing next in award shall be moved up accordingly. See USEF GR603 and GR603.1.

HELMET RULE: It is compulsory for all persons at Federation licensed hunter, jumper or hunter/jumper competitions when mounted anywhere on the competition grounds, to wear properly fastened protective headgear which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEl tag. It must be properly fitted with harness secured. Exception: In Hunter or Jumper classes, adults may be allowed to remove their headgear while accepting prizes and during the playing of the National Anthem only; they must refasten their headgear prior to the lap of honor. It is compulsory for riders in Paso Fino classes, both open and breed restricted including Hunter Hack, where jumping is required and when jumping anywhere on the competition grounds to wear properly fastened protective headgear which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEl (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. It must be properly fitted with harness secured. A Show Committee, Competition Management, and Licensed Officials must bar riders without protective headgear from entering the ring for classes in which protective headgear is required and may bar any entry or person from entering the ring if not suitably presented to appear before an audience.

DRUG TESTING: State of California drug testing rules apply. For a copy contact the Show Office.

GOLF CARTS AND BICYCLES: Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule. The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating

the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

PARKING: Parking allowed in designated areas only. Violators parked in NO PARKING ZONES and FIRE LANES will be issued citations and/or towed from the premises at the owner's expense. There are Handicap parking areas in the Stable Area and public parking lot.

WASHING HORSES: Nozzles are required on all hoses to help conserve water.
STALL CLEANING: Please deposit all manure in the concrete manure bins and NOT in the middle or in front of the stalls. Upon departure from the show, if excessive cleanup is required there will be a $\$ 500$ fee charged. Trainers are encouraged to supervise their staff to avoid this fee.

TURNOUTS AND LUNGING: Horses may not be turned-out in arenas at any time. Lunging is in designated areas only.

MEDICAL WASTE: All needles and syringes MUST be deposited in designated disposal containers and not left in stalls or thrown in trash receptacles. Violators will be fined $\$ 75$ per needle/syringe. For the first offense, the trainer/owner will be notified as well as the appropriate Association. The second offense will disqualify the individual and horse and they will be banished from the show with NO REFUND.

ORDER OF GO: There will be a posted order of go in all classes. Any anticipated scheduling conflicts should be brought to the attention of the starters who will advise you on how it will be resolved. Under no circumstances will the Horse Show be interrupted due to a competitor failing to present himself at the gate in a timely manner. Multiple rides must be shown in the correct order. Failure to do so will result in elimination. In hunter classes with double rounds, a posted order will be observed with a rotation of three rounds.

AWARDS PRESENTATIONS: In all classes, an awards presentation will be made. A suitable horse should be available for classes where it is required to ride for awards. Riders failing to present themselves for award presentations will forfeit all prize money. Trophy to First Place, Ribbons through eighth place except where otherwise noted.

CHAMPION AND RESERVE CHAMPION AWARDS: Champion and Reserve will be awarded in all divisions that have three classes that fill.

INSURANCE: All owners and competitors are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents, or their animals. They are therefore strongly advised to take out third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date.

OFFICE \& GROUNDS: All horses entered in the competition must pay a mandatory office/grounds fee of $\$ 85.00$.

NON-SHOWING HORSES: Non-showing horses are not permitted in the show areas.

TIES: In all jumper classes, ties involving first place will be jumped off. All other ties will be determined by time taken to complete the first round.

ATTIRE: Proper attire is required in all hunter, equitation rings during competition as well as Jumper classes with $\$ 1,000$ or more in prize money.

SUBSTITUTIONS: Substitution of horses are allowed with the same owner.
PRIZE MONEY: Prize money will be deducted from each account at the show.

Prize money checks will also be available at the show once the horse has completed showing. NO PRIZE MONEY WILL BE DEDUCTED/PAID/MAILED UNLESS THE OWNER'S OR PAYEE'S SOCIAL SECURITY/TAX ID NUMBER IS LISTED ON THE ENTRY FORM. Any prize money that is to be paid to someone other than the owner listed on the entry blank must be written on the entry blank at the time of entry. Change of payee will not be permitted at the show. The Internal Revenue Service requires 30\% of prize money won by foreign exhibitors to be withheld. Foreign exhibitors should apply for a U.S. Social Security number and are required to complete a W-8 Certificate of Foreign Status Form. Unless otherwise stated, prize money will be distributed through 6th place as follows- $30 \%, 22 \%, 16 \%, 12 \%, 10 \%, 10 \%$. Management reserves the right to adjust the prize money of any class at any time. No prize money will be paid to classes that are run with fewer than 3 entries. Jumper classics require a minimum of 6 entries to be held or they will be combined or canceled, and may be run with no prize money.

NON SMOKING EVENT: The events included in this prize list are non smoking events in accordance with California State Law SB-977 Tobacco: youth sports events.

MICROCHIP VERIFICATION: All horses competing in classes that require USHJA horse registration must provide a microchip number that verifies their animal's identity in order to compete for points, money won or be eligible for Federation and/or USHJA programs and awards where horses are required to be recorded or registered. A microchip used to verify identity must be a fifteen-digit ISO compliant $11784 / 11785$ chip and be implanted in the nuchal ligament of the animal. All horses that are competing in classes which require USHJA registration which are not microchipped will be ineligible to compete in Federation licensed competitions, Exceptions: USHJA Outreach and those activities enumerated in GR901.9, items 1-9.

SAFE SPORT VERIFICATION: As of January 1, 2019 all USEF members 18-years-old and older, with a Competing Membership, must complete SafeSport Training in order to be eligible to participate in USEF activities, including competitions. Please see the USEF website at https://www.usef.org/ compete/resources-forms/rulesregulations/safe-sport for more information. Those who do not complete the training will be ineligible to participate in USEF activities, including competitions.

In accordance with GR1111.4: All members may compete for Zone Awards or money in any state contiguous to Zone 10: OR, ID, UT, AZ

JUDGING FOR ALL HUNTER SECTIONS: To be judged on performance and soundness, suitability to count.

ELIGIBILITY FOR ADULT AMATEURS: HUNTER, JUMPER AND EQUITATION: To be ridden by exhibitors who have reached their 18th birthday as of December 1 of the current competition year and who hold a current USEF Amateur certification. Open to horses and ponies.

ELIGIBILITY FOR CHILDREN'S SECTIONS: HUNTER, JUMPER AND EQUITATION: To be ridden by exhibitors who have not reached their 18th birthday as of December 1 of the current competition year.

ADULT AMATEUR HUNTER Sections offered and requirements: Adult Amateurs - may be split into three (3) sections. Cross Entry: Riders: Riders may not cross enter into any Green Hunter 3'6", Green Hunter 3'9" or High Performance Hunter class at the same competition. Exception - under saddle classes. Adult Amateur Riders may not cross enter into any class at the same competition with fences exceeding $3^{\prime} 3$ " except Jumper Classes not exceeding 1.25 m , Equitation and Medal Classes, and the USHJA National Hunter Derby. Riders may cross enter between the Adult Amateur Hunter and the Amateur Owner section if the rider owns the horse he or she is showing in the Adult Amateur section. An Adult Amateur rider may ride an Amateur Owner Hunter in the A/O Under Saddle Class for an Amateur Owner Hunter rider that has more than one horse entered. No cross entry restrictions at one-day competitions.
Horses: Horses may not cross enter into any Amateur Owner hunter class (at the same show). No cross entry restrictions at one-day competitions. Horse and Rider Combination: No cross entry restrictions at one-day competitions. Fence Height: $3^{\prime} 0$ " with spreads not to exceed the fence height. Courses will not be adjusted for ponies.In and outs are permitted. Classics: Three (3) entries are required to conduct a Hunter Classic. The Low Adult Amateur Hunter Horse section may only be combined with the Children's Hunter Pony and Low Children's Hunter Horse sections after those sections have been combined and still do not meet the three (3) entry minimum. Awards: Zone Horse of the Year Awards will be presented annually to the following section: Low Adult Amateur Hunter.

Rider: $1.00 / 1.05 \mathrm{~m}$ Amateur Jumper riders may not cross enter into any jumper class with fences exceeding $1.15 \mathrm{~m} .1 .10 / 1.15 \mathrm{~m}$ Amateur Jumper riders may not cross enter into any jumper class with fences exceeding 1.25 m . Horse/Pony: $\mathrm{n} / \mathrm{a}$. Horse and Rider Combination: $\mathrm{n} / \mathrm{a}$. Fence Height: Amateur Jumper
1.00 m to 1.05 m . Amateur Jumper 1.10 m for the first class of the section. In all other classes of the section fences to be set no lower than 1.10 m and no higher than 1.15 m . New Jumper Chapter Rules<br>Effective Dec 1st for the 2024 Competion Year

## JP 102 Horse Welfare

2. Conduct outside of the competition ring: Any action(s) against a horse by an exhibitor, deemed excessive by a judge, Federation Steward, Certified Schooling Supervisor or Competition Veterinarian anywhere on the competion grounds may be punished by official warning or elimination from the class. Such action(s) could include, but are not limited to: excessive or improper use of the whip, spurs, reins, rider's weight or rider's hands; lunging a visibly exhausted horse; lunging an obviously lame horse; chasing a horse with a lunge whip or other inappropriate use of the whip; the use of a lunge whip with any type of appendage or atachment, including but not limited to bags and flags; excessive and/or disruptive cracking of the whip. In addition, after consultation with the Competition Manager and a Competition Steward, additional penalties, including one or more of the following: the issuance of an official warning card, disqualification from competing within the upcoming 24 -hour period, or disqualification from the balance of the competition. All such violations must be recorded in the Steward's Report.

## JP 103 Schooling

## 2. Schooling Supervision Requirements

a. An individual with a C1 Steward or Certified Schooling Supervisor license must be present in the schooling area during any Jumper class offering $\$ 10,000$ to $\$ 24,999$ in prize money. See GR1041 for conflict of interest restrictions.
b. An individual with a "R" C1 Steward or Certified Schooling Supervisor license must be appointed to supervise schooling before and during the classes offering \$25,000 or more in prize money. See GR1041 for conflict of interest restric®ons.
c. The minimum number of required competition Steward(s) must always remain available to atend to other stewarding duties. (See GR1211.4 and GR1041)

## JP111 Tack and Attire

5. The total maximum weight of equipment allowed to be added to a Horse's leg, front or hind (single or multiple boots, fetlock rings, etc.), is 500 grams or 17.637 ounces (shoe excluded). Failure to comply with this paragraph will incur disqualification.
a. See JP 117.2 for Classes Restricted by Age of Horse.
b. For classes to be included in the USEF Ranking List, the following will also apply to hind boots. Fasteners may only be Velcro, stud type, or hook type. No mechanism that allows the fastener to double back on itself or any kind of leverage to be applied to the fastener is permited. No additional elements may be added to or inserted in the boot itself. The inside of the boot must be non-abrasive and smooth, that is, the surface must be even and there may not be any pressure points on the inside of the boot. Sheepskin linings are allowed.

## JP 117 Sections/Classes Restricted by Age of Horse

7. Restrictions. See also specific restrictions in each age category above. Horses competing in Five, Six, or Seven Year Old jumper

2. The pre-determined number must be from 6 to 16 but in no case more than the number of places to be awarded, the exact number to be indicated in the prize list. Those tied for the final predetermined number, including clear rounds, will be determined by their time in the first round. The order of go for the jump-off round will be reverse order of scores (faults and time) from the first round. Adjustment of this order, in the case of one rider qualifying multiple horses, may be allowed at management's discretion.
