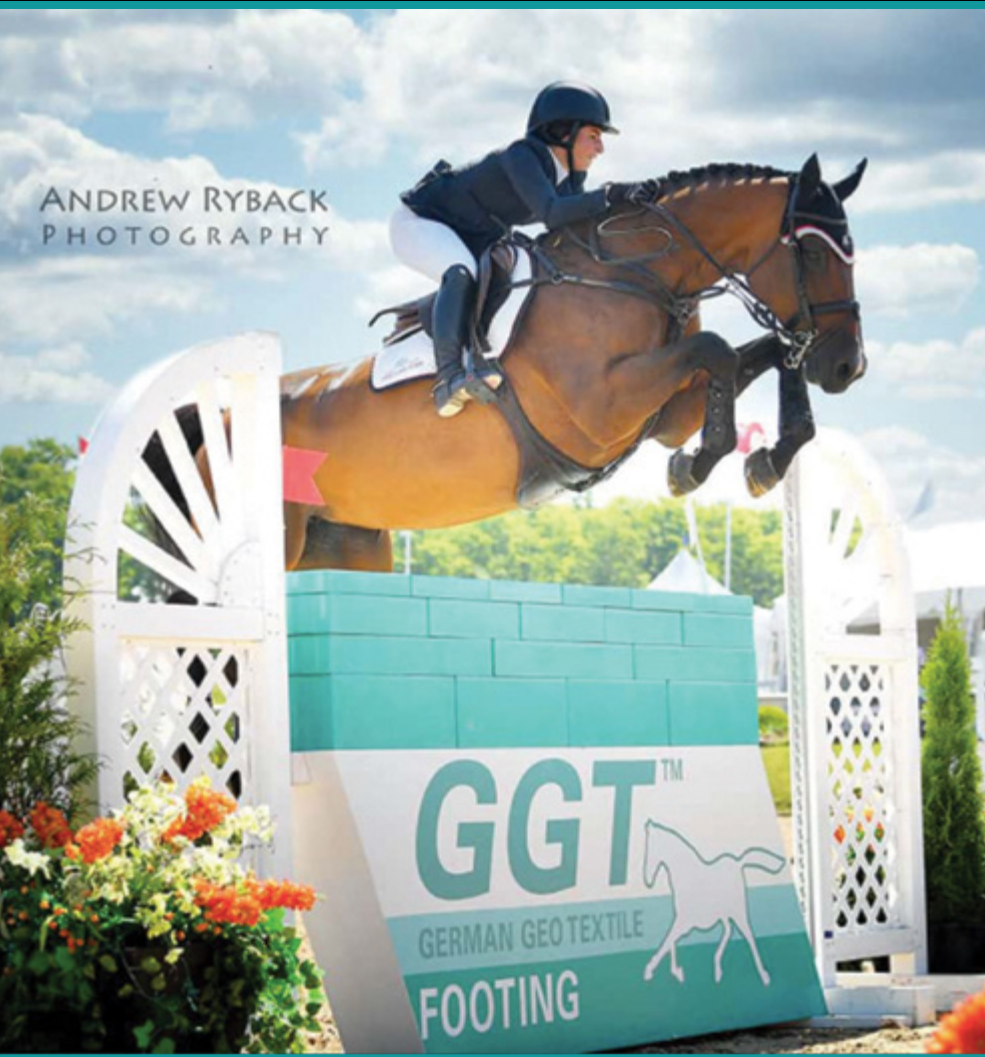


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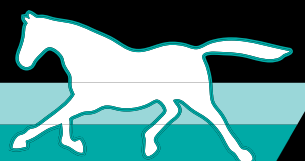

OUTREACH CLASSES

The following classes are part of the 2024 USHJA Outreach Program. USEF and USHJA membership is not required to participate in an Outreach Competition or in any Outreach classes. Non-USEF and USHJA members will NOT be charged a Non-Member or Show Pass Fee. Riders and Trainers must be USHJA members at the free Outreach level or higher in order to be eligible for points toward year end awards. Hunter championships will be presented in each hunter section with the top four over fences earning under saddle points. Equitation championships will be presented in each equitation section with points counting equally for all classes. Combined section championships will be presented in each combined section with points counting equally for all classes. Ties broken by the most points over fences; if still tied, then most points in the equitation flat class.

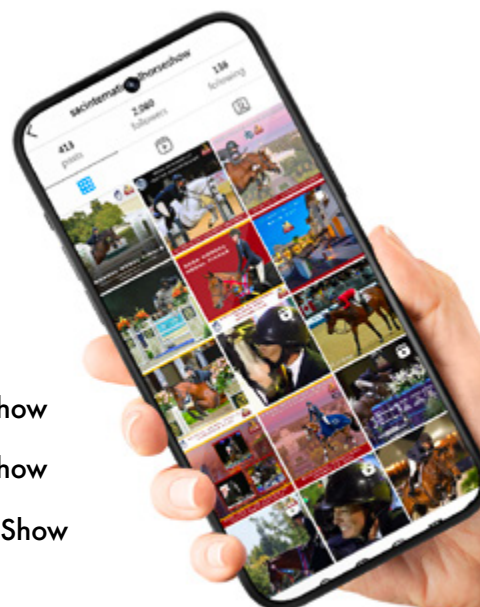

SPECIAL CLASSES

HUNTER CLASSICS

Exhibitors must enter the classic prior to the start of the first round class. Scratches are not permitted after the first round class has begun. See the time schedule for the designated first round class. Horses must have entered, shown, and completed the course in at least two of the respective hunter division classes over fences at this show to enter the classics. To be judged on performance and soundness, suitability and manners to count. To be scored under the open numerical judging system. To be shown over a course of approximately 10 jumps of height designated by the qualifying division. The twelve horses with the highest scores from the first round will return to jump a second round over a different course. In the event of equality in the first round, all equal scores will return for the second round. Scores will be combined from the first round with the second round to determine overall winners. Trophy to first, ribbons through 8.

ELIGIBILITY/RESTRICTIONS: No cross entry from Junior & Senior Finals to 3ft JR/AM Finals, Open to riders who have qualified since last year's finals. Any horse may be used by a competitor (a stallion may not be ridden by a junior) but the same horse must be used for all rounds, one rider per horse. In the event of illness or injury to a horse, a rider may petition the Appeals Committee to be allowed a substitution horse. Riders in the NorCal Pony Medal Final may not compete in the NorCal Junior Medal Final. Suitability of pony to rider will be emphasized.

COURSES: 3' Jr/Am, Junior and Senior - to be judged over two rounds and a work-off. The course must include at least one combination, including an oxer, and at least two changes of direction after the first fence. Pony - to be judged over two rounds and a workoff. Hunter-type fences will be used and fence heights will be according to USEF specifications for small, medium and large ponies. Course will consist of not less than six fences with at least one change of direction.

DRAW FOR ORDER OF GO: The first round order will be drawn on Friday, September 28th (see office for time and location).

FIRST ROUND: All riders will compete in the first round. Each judge will give an independent score, which will be announced. Judges will sit separately for judging the first round. The scores will be averaged for each rider. Ribbons 1st through 10th to be presented.

SECOND ROUND: All riders will return for the second round low score to high score from the first round. In the event of a tie score in the first round, the steward shall draw for the order of those tied. The scores will again be announced and averaged, and ribbons presented 1st through 10th for this round. Judges will sit separately for judging the second round.

WORK-OFF: The averages from both rounds will be totaled. The four riders with the highest scores, and any other rider whose score is within three points of the top score, will be required to work off individually. The work-off will be determined by the judges. Judges will sit together for judging the work off. Workoff scores will not be announced. The scores from the work-off will be averaged. This number will then be added to the number carried forward from round one and two. The highest overall score will be the winning score. Workoff scores will not be announced.

OVERALL AWARDS: Special awards and ribbons will be presented to the top ten finalists in each medal final. In all of the above, any rider not eliminated and completing the course will receive a score from the judges which shall be greater than zero. An Appeals Committee made up of the Show Manager, USEF Steward and a member of the NorCal Board of Directors will be available to receive protests. A protest must be written, signed and handed to a member of the Appeals Committee within one hour of the conclusion of a class. No money needs to be given with the protest. Except for what is specified above, USEF rules governing equitation classes will be followed.

ELIGIBILITY: The CPHA Style of Riding Jumper Championship Class is open to all Jr/Am riders who are current members of the CPHA, and whose trainers are current members of the CPHA. The rider must have competed in at least one CPHA Style of Riding Class during the current show year in order to qualify for the Championship.

CLASS CONDITIONS: This class is a jumper seat equitation class held in the jumper ring over a course of fences set at 1.00m-1.05m in height with spreads to 1.15m, in a Table II, 2a format. The course must contain a triple or two double combinations and a Liverpool. The Liverpool may not be used in the combination. The course should be of the type used in a Children/Adult Jumper Classic. Time allowed will be calculated at 350 meters per minute. A jumper type horse and conventional jumper equipment will not be penalized and standing and running martingales ARE permitted. Draw reins and German martingales are NOT permitted. When there is an equality of jumping/time faults then the judge's subjective style of riding score will break the tie. A rider must have no jumping (or time) faults as well as a judge's score of 75 or better to compete in the jump off round. The time allowed must be carefully monitored for the first three riders that complete the course successfully in the first round and in the jump off, and adjusted if the judge or course designer deems necessary.

JUDGING: The class will be judged under a modified Table II, 2a format. At the completion of the first round all riders with clear rounds (no jumping or time faults) AND a total score of 75 or better will come back to complete the jump off/work off shortened course. The jump off/work off will be scored in the

same manner as the first round, with an emphasis placed on an efficient time saving pace and track. The judge's jump off score of the rider is added to their first round score and the rider with the highest cumulative score and the least faults is the winner. Time allowed will be based on a speed of 350m/m, in the Jump off round. The judges are asked to walk the course when possible and where there are striding options, the judges are asked not to penalize any option that might be used to achieve the best result appropriate to the track taken and the individual horse/rider combination. The judges will evaluate the rider's ability as a show jumping rider, and the manner in which the course was ridden regarding technical merit, judgment, and the execution of an efficient, time saving pace and track in meeting the specific challenges incorporated into the course by the course designer. The jumping faults and the judge's equitation score will be announced after each round. There is no need to deduct the time and jumping faults from the numerical score. The judge can do that on their card if they wish but it will not be announced. Just the jumping/time faults and the tie breaking judge's score will be announced. The remaining placings for the class (competitors not participating in the jump off), will be determined by the rider with the least number of faults and the highest judge's score. (Basically scored as a jumper class, but the judge's score instead of the time breaks the tie when there is an equality of faults).

START ORDER: Round 1 will be computer drawn, round 2 (The jump off round for clean rounds) will be from low to high from the Judge's score from the first round. Follow USEF Jumper Schooling Rules

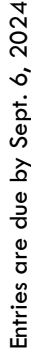

I knowingly, willingly, and voluntarily acknowledge the inherent risks associated with the sport of equestrian and know that horseback riding and related equestrian activities are inherently dangerous, and that participation in any equestrian event involves risks and dangers including, without limitation, the potential for serious bodily injury (including broken bones, head or neck injuries), sickness and disease (including communicable diseases such as COVID-19), trauma, pain & suffering, permanent disability, paralysis and death; loss of or damage to personal property (including my mount & equipment) arising out of the unpredictable behavior of horses; exposure to extreme conditions and circumstances; accidents involving other participants, event staff, volunteers or spectators; contact or collision with other participants and horses, natural or manmade objects; adverse weather conditions; facilities issues and premises conditions; failure of protective equipment (including helmets); inadequate safety measures; participants of varying skill levels; situations beyond the immediate control of MEC or Event organizers and competition management; and other undefined, not readily foreseeable and presently unknown risks and dangers.

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RULES, REGULATIONS & GENERAL INFORMATION

These competitions are governed and approved by the United States Equestrian Federation. Every class offered herein which is covered by the rules and specifications of the current USEF Rule Book will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith. To the extent there is a conflict between the prize list and the USEF rules, USEF rules will prevail. Senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A non-member may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, or agent, at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot (exception: Friesian performance FR231) and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions. 8) Opportunity classes, 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

REMINDER: All USEF Life and Senior Active members, as well as participants who have regular contact with minor athletes, are required to comply with the U.S. Center for SafeSport training requirement to be eligible to participate in the competition. All participants must adhere to the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code, USEF Safe Sport Policy, and the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies. More information about these can be found at www.usef.org.

USEF ENTRY AGREEMENT: By entering a Federation licensed Competition and signing this entry blank as the Owner, Lessee, Trainer, Manager, Agent, Coach, Driver, Rider, Handler, Vaultor or Longueur and on behalf of myself and my principals, representatives, employees and agents, I agree that I am subject to the Bylaws and Rules of The United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (the "Federation"). I agree to be bound by the Bylaws and Rules of the Federation and of the competition. I will accept as final the decision of the Hearing Committee on any question arising under the Rules, and agree to release and hold harmless the competition, the Federation, their officials, directors and employees for any action taken under the Rules. I represent that I am eligible to enter and/or participate under the rules, and every horse I am entering is eligible as entered. I also agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry, the Federation and/ or the competition may use or assign photographs, videos, audios, cablecasts, broadcasts, internet, film, new media, or other likenesses of me and my horse taken during the course of the competition for the promotion, coverage or benefit of the competition, sport, or the Federation. Those likenesses shall not be used to advertise a product and they may not be used in such a way as to jeopardize amateur status. I hereby expressly and irrevocably waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to compensation, invasion of privacy, right of publicity, or

to misappropriation. The construction and application of Federation rules are governed by the laws of the State of New York, and any action instituted against the Federation must be filed in New York State. See GR 908.4. The Horse Show Committee reserves the right to itself to interpret all questions and conditions in regard to or arising out of, or incident to the show without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. All questions not covered in these Rules and Regulations shall be decided by the Horse Show Management; its decision to be final. The Horse Show Management reserves to itself the right to limit entries in any class, section or division, to refuse, accept conditionally, or to cancel any entries, disqualify any riders or exhibitors, prohibit exhibition of entries, and cancel award prizes, without any claim for damages; to change any course, to add a dotted line, to cancel or combine any unfilled classes, or to reschedule classes, after due notice to exhibitors; to change rings or rotate judges; to change specifications in Jumper classes as competition warrants. Every horse entered herein for competition will be under the control of the Horse Show Management, but the Show Management will in no case be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur, and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold the horse show and the officials, employees, directors, officers, sponsoring entities of the horse show and the facilities at which the horse show is held blameless for any loss or accident to his horse(s), employee(s), or equipment which may occur from sickness, fire or other cause. Every class offered herein which is covered by the rules and specifications of the current USEF Rule Book will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith. In the event of a cancellation due to severe weather or other emergency, refunds of entry fees must be made upon request by the exhibitor within 30 days of the cancellation.

USEF WAIVER AND RELEASE OF LIABILITY, ASSUMPTION OF RISK AND INDEMNITY AGREEMENT: Effective immediately, all individuals on the property will be required to sign the USEF Waiver and Release of Liability, Assumption of Risk and Indemnity Agreement. The Agreement will be available on our website (www.westpalmsevents.com) and can be executed and signed electronically.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY: Every horse entered for competition will be under the control of the Horse Show Management, but Horse Show Management will, in no case, be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur, and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall defend, indemnify and hold harmless the Horse Show and its officials, employees, directors, officers, West Palms Event Management, and its Sponsors, etc for any loss or accident to his horse, horses, employees or equipment which may occur from sickness, fire or other cause.

MANAGEMENT: Horse Show Management reserves the right to interpret all questions and conditions in regard to or arising out of an incident to the show without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. All questions not covered in these Rules and Regulations shall be decided by Horse Show Management-their decision to be final. Horse Show Management reserves the right to refuse, accept conditionally or to cancel any entries, disqualify riders or exhibitors, prohibit exhibition of entries and cancel award prizes, without claim for damages; to change any course, to cancel or combine any unfilled

classes, or to reschedule classes, after due notice to exhibitors; to change rings or rotate or change judges and officials; to change specifications in jumper classes in order to facilitate the time schedule. Management reserves the right to combine or cancel. Management reserves the right to limit entries in a class. Refused entries will be returned.

ASSUMPTION OF RISK: By signing the entry blank, the Owner, Lessee, Trainer, Manager, Agent, Coach, Driver, Rider, Handler, Vaulteur or Loungeur acknowledges that horseback riding, particularly jumping, is a dangerous activity and involves inherent risks that may cause serious injury and in some cases death because of the unpredictable nature and irrational behavior of horses, regardless of their training and past performance and expressly assumes all such inherent risks whether identified herein, in the entry blank, or in the Federation Rules and Regulations. A horse, without warning or any apparent cause, can buck, stumble, fall, rear, bite, kick, run, make unpredictable movements, spook, jump obstacles, step on a person's foot or push a person—all of which may cause the rider or observer to fall or be jolted, resulting in serious injury or death. A horse may also become loose and cause injury to an observer or rider or to another horse—a loose horse can run at full gallop in a panic and run into objects or persons or other horses. The Show Ground Facilities are bordered by highways/roads and thus noise from traffic and other sources occurs that can and will cause a horse to unexpectedly spook or react quickly. The Show Ground Facilities contain roads or driveways that are traversed by cars, golf carts, tractors, trailers and heavy equipment all of which may spook a horse. The above warnings and risks are meant as an example of some of the risks that are inherent and may be encountered but it is agreed this is not an exhaustive list and there are numerous additional conditions and/or events that may result in injuries while participating in the Competition and/or being present on the Show Ground Facility.

THE FOLLOWING IS REQUIRED FOR EACH ENTRY:

- A. All horses on grounds must be registered on an entry blank including horses not entered in classes. One entry blank per horse.
- B. Entry forms must be complete with owner, riders, trainers and payee information including association membership numbers.
- C. Date of Birth of all minor exhibitors.
- D. Signatures of owner, riders, trainer and parent or guardian of minor exhibitors. Parents or guardians of minor exhibitors shall hold the Horse Show, West Palms Event Management, Inc., Murieta Equestrian Center and staff harmless for injury to such minor(s).
- E. Entries must be submitted electronically through showgroundslive.com.
- F. For all horses include Nomination and Stall Fees as a deposit. Make checks payable to Sacramento International Horse Show or complete the credit card information through your [showgroundslive](http://showgroundslive.com) account.

Accounts must be closed at the end of each show week. Management will close Exhibitor Accounts that have not been settled at the conclusion of each show. Back numbers will not be issued until previous week balances are closed. Exhibitors must close out their account online through ShowGroundsLive. Exhibitors who do not close out by the Monday following each show automatically authorize SIHS to close

their account using the Credit Card on file. Billing questions or refunds will not be considered after two weeks following the conclusion of the show. Should you have any questions or concerns with your bill, please email the horse show office directly. The Horse Show policies herein stated regarding scratches and refunds will be followed regardless of weather and in place of GR 912. Receipt of any entry form to SIHS, whether bearing signature or not, will constitute an entry and will be subject to the Rules and Regulations of this prize list.

PAYMENT: An open check or credit card is required at time of check in before numbers will be issued. See 6F for deposit information. A 3% credit card fee will be applied to all credit card transactions and is nonrefundable once the card has been processed.

REFUNDS: Request for a refund of the deposit must be in writing and received before the closing date of entries and a \$35.00 fee will be deducted. The nomination and stall fees are not refundable under any condition after the close of entries. Credit Card fees are nonrefundable at any time after the card has been processed.

POST ENTRIES: Entries received with payment after entries are due but before the Monday of each show will pay a \$75.00 late fee. All entries received at the show will pay a \$150.00 late fee.

TRAINER SPLITS: WPEM allows trainers to split the show charges for miscellaneous items to their clients. Splits will be accepted until noon on the Friday of a show week. No exceptions will be made. Only items billed by the horse show directly can be split. Splits will revert back to the trainer for payment if uncollected.

ADDS/SCRATCHES: All adds must be made by 4:00 pm the day prior to each class. No entries will be accepted for a class scheduled on the same day. **In the unusual case the time schedule allows a management approved add the day of a class, the entry fee will be double.** Horses and riders who go in a class without entering will pay a fee of \$50.00. All scratches must be received in the show office before the start of the class in writing to be considered for a refund; scratches via phone call or at the gate will NOT be considered. In divisions that are entered by complete section, no refund will be considered if the horse shows in any class of the division. The only other refunds given will be for cancellation of a class by Management, overpayment of fees, or the rejection of entries because of ineligibility or lack of stall space.

RAIN: In the event of rain prior to the Show, it is the riders' responsibility to call Show Management to determine whether the show is canceled.

RESPONSIBILITY OF PAYMENT OF SERVICES AND SUPPLIES: All owners and exhibitors will be held responsible for any damage incurred by them, their animals, agents, or employees, to stalls, buildings and other properties on the Show grounds and shall be billed accordingly. All bills for veterinary, farrier services and feed/bedding are due and payable during the Show. Management reserves the right to deduct any unpaid veterinary, farrier and feed/bedding bills from premium money due the exhibitor. Any exhibitor not meeting his obligations to the official Show Veterinarian, farrier

and feed/bedding vendor will be termed an undesirable exhibitor and entries from that exhibitor may not be accepted at subsequent shows.

RETURNED CHECKS/CHARGEBACKS: Checks returned by the bank or Credit card chargebacks for any reason are regarded as a most serious offense and will be handled according to the following procedure: A \$50 penalty will be assessed for each returned check or chargeback OR 10% of the face value of the check or chargeback, whichever is greater. Accounts will be given ten (10) days to be paid in full with cash or cash equivalent or they will be reported to the U.S. Equestrian Federation, Inc., PCHA and other appropriate association(s) for further disciplinary action. Checks will not be deposited a second time. In the case that the debt is not cleared within 30 days of the conclusion of the show, all prize money will be forfeited.

UNPAID CHARGES: Any exhibitor leaving the show with an unpaid balance will be billed for these charges and a \$50 billing fee will be added to the total due. Until these charges are settled, all further entries of rider and owner will be returned.

SAFETY REGULATIONS: Unauthorized use of the light fixtures will result in removal of your appliance. Smoking or open flame devices are not permitted within the stables. Keep flammable decorations to a minimum. Electrical outlets are provided.

CLOSED RINGS: Horses are not permitted in any ring where a course is set unless otherwise given permission from management, or when there is equipment in the ring. Please check with the show office for information regarding schooling policies. Horses and riders must yield immediately for watering and dragging. Violations of the above mentioned rules may be considered cause for elimination from the show.

RING INFORMATION: In all jumper classes, competitors will be given forty-five (45) seconds to cross the start line. All show and warm-up arenas consist of sand/fiber footing. Jumper Rings 130' X 250', 130' X 220', Hunter Rings 100' X 230', 120' X 230'.

STABLING: National Stalls and tack rooms will be available for \$425.00. NorCal Medal finalists will get a discount on their horses' stall for Welcome Week and pay \$250.00. Hauling in is allowed at \$75.00 per day per horse. No bedding included. Water buckets and hoses must be provided by the exhibitor. NO straw or synthetic/paper materials permitted- only wood shavings. It is strictly forbidden to remove stall doors. Exhibitors will be billed for any damage to property. **IF YOU LEAVE ANYTHING BEHIND IN THE STABLE AREA, YOU WILL BE BILLED A MINIMUM OF \$500. IF YOU LEAVE SYRINGES ANYWHERE OTHER THAN THE RECEPTACLES PROVIDED YOU WILL BE BILLED \$500 PER SYRINGE. THIS WILL BE STRICTLY ENFORCED.**

ROLEX/USEF RANKING LIST: Please reference www.ryegate.com for the current ROLEX/USEF Show Jumping Ranking list and competitions to count.

FEED AND BEDDING: Pre-orders and onsite orders must be submitted

through www.westpalmsevents.com. (online order form) Orders must be made by NOON. each day for same-day delivery through the website.

TIES: In all jumper classes, ties involving first place will be jumped off. All other ties will be determined by time taken to complete the first round.

SCHOOLING SUPERVISION: Gate Stewards are schooling supervisors and have absolute authority to scratch riders who do not follow USEF, FEI or appropriate association schooling rules. Horses competing in FEI Division may only school at posted times and in designated areas.

NUMBERS: Management will provide a number card for each competitor which shall be worn clearly visible to the judge at all times when in competition. Riders wearing the wrong number or no number at all MAY be eliminated from the class by the judges.

DOGS: Dogs and other pets must be on leashes at all times. A \$100 fine will be charged for all loose dogs.

VACCINATION INFORMATION: Beginning December 1, 2015, all horses entering the grounds of a Federation- licensed competition must be accompanied by documentation of Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhinopneumonitis) vaccinations within six months prior to entering the stables. The management in consultation with respected veterinarians and local animal health authorities strongly recommend and urge that all horses attending the show follow a two-part West Nile vaccination protocol consisting of a primary vaccination, followed by a booster 3-6 weeks later. Should you have any questions please contact the CDFA.

EQUINE HEALTH REQUIREMENTS: Equine Health Requirements will be enforced. All horses (competing or not) that enter the grounds are required to present the Required Health Entry Requirements, including the Event Participation Declaration and Proof of Vaccination. All horses are subject to examination by WPEM officials/designated representatives and/or state officials (collectively "officials") for determining whether such animals are, have been infected/exposed, or are likely to become infected with an infectious or contagious disease. If after such examination, officials have reason to believe that an animal's health condition places other animals at risk, such officials, at their sole discretion, may quarantine such animal (and others that may have been infected/exposed) or, if appropriate, require that such animals be transported off the grounds. All participants agree to fully cooperate with event officials and abide by their decisions and instructions. Failure to comply shall be grounds for immediate expulsion and potential disciplinary action by organization, state/ local or federal animal health officials. All exhibitors are encouraged to review the equine health entry/transport requirements of the destination state prior to entry. Additional information can be obtained from the State Vet Office. Please refer to the www.westpalmsevents.com and the show office for current Equine Health and Biosecurity measures.

ARRIVAL AND DEPARTURE: WEEK 1: may not arrive before 10:00 am, Monday, September 23 and must vacate by Sunday

night September 29 unless staying to compete in Week 2. **WEEK 2:** may not arrive before 12 noon, Monday, September 30 and must vacate by Sunday night October 6 at the conclusion of the show. No layovers without prior authorization. Early/late arrivals must have prior management approval and will be charged \$50 per stall/tack room per night. Early arrivals without the approval of management will be charged \$65.00 per stall per night.

PROTEST: Any USEF member lodging a protest must first deposit \$200 (non-members \$300) payable to West Palms Event Management with the Show Secretary, which sum shall be forfeited to the Horse Show, if the same is not sustained. All protests must be in writing, signed by the protester and filed within 48 hours of the occurrence of the alleged violation. A protest may be filed with the Show Manager, the Federation Hearing committee or Show Secretary. If the protest is sustained, the entries standing next in award shall be moved up accordingly. See USEF GR603 and GR603.1.

HELMET RULE: It is compulsory for all persons at Federation licensed hunter, jumper or hunter/jumper competitions when mounted anywhere on the competition grounds, to wear properly fastened protective headgear which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. It must be properly fitted with harness secured. Exception: In Hunter or Jumper classes, adults may be allowed to remove their headgear while accepting prizes and during the playing of the National Anthem only; they must refasten their headgear prior to the lap of honor. It is compulsory for riders in Paso Fino classes, both open and breed restricted including Hunter Hack, where jumping is required and when jumping anywhere on the competition grounds to wear properly fastened protective headgear which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. It must be properly fitted with harness secured. A Show Committee, Competition Management, and Licensed Officials must bar riders without protective headgear from entering the ring for classes in which protective headgear is required and may bar any entry or person from entering the ring if not suitably presented to appear before an audience.

DRUG TESTING: State of California drug testing rules apply. For a copy contact the Show Office.

GOLF CARTS AND BICYCLES: Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license.

The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule. The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

PARKING: Parking allowed in designated areas only. Violators parked in NO PARKING ZONES and FIRE LANES will be issued citations and/or towed from the premises at the owner's expense. There are Handicap parking areas in the Stable Area and public parking lot.

WASHING HORSES: Nozzles are required on all hoses to help conserve water.

STALL CLEANING: Please deposit all manure in the concrete manure bins and NOT in the middle or in front of the stalls. **Upon departure from the show, if excessive cleanup is required there will be a \$500 fee charged. Trainers are encouraged to supervise their staff to avoid this fee.**

TURNOUTS AND LUNGING: Horses may not be turned-out in arenas at any time. Lunging is in designated areas only.

MEDICAL WASTE: All needles and syringes **MUST** be deposited in designated disposal containers and not left in stalls or thrown in trash receptacles. Violators will be fined \$75 per needle/syringe. For the first offense, the trainer/owner will be notified as well as the appropriate Association. The second offense will disqualify the individual and horse and they will be banished from the show with NO REFUND.

ORDER OF GO: There will be a posted order of go in all classes. Any anticipated scheduling conflicts should be brought to the attention of the starters who will advise you on how it will be resolved. Under no circumstances will the Horse Show be interrupted due to a competitor failing to present himself at the gate in a timely manner. Multiple rides must be shown in the correct order. Failure to do so will result in elimination. In hunter classes with double rounds, a posted order will be observed with a rotation of three rounds.

AWARDS PRESENTATIONS: In all classes, an awards presentation

will be made. A suitable horse should be available for classes where it is required to ride for awards. Riders failing to present themselves for award presentations will forfeit all prize money. Trophy to First Place, Ribbons through eighth place except where otherwise noted.

CHAMPION AND RESERVE CHAMPION AWARDS: Champion and Reserve will be awarded in all divisions that have three classes that fill.

INSURANCE: All owners and competitors are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents, or their animals. They are therefore strongly advised to take out third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date.

OFFICE & GROUNDS: All horses entered in the competition must pay a mandatory office/grounds fee of \$85.00.

NON-SHOWING HORSES: Non-showing horses are not permitted in the show areas.

ATTIRE: Proper attire is required in all hunter, equitation rings during competition as well as Jumper classes with \$1,000 or more in prize money.

SUBSTITUTIONS: Substitution of horses are allowed with the same owner.

PRIZE MONEY: Prize money will be deducted from each account at the show. Prize money checks will also be available at the show once the horse has completed showing. NO PRIZE MONEY WILL BE DEDUCTED/PAID/MAILED UNLESS THE OWNER'S OR PAYEE'S SOCIAL SECURITY/TAX ID NUMBER IS LISTED ON THE ENTRY FORM. Any prize money that is to be paid to someone other than the owner listed on the entry blank must be written on the entry blank at the time of entry. Change of payee will not be permitted at the show. The Internal Revenue Service requires 30% of prize money won by foreign exhibitors to be withheld. Foreign exhibitors should apply for a U.S. Social Security number and are required to complete a W-8 Certificate of Foreign Status Form. Unless otherwise stated, prize money will be distributed through 6th place as follows- 30%, 22%, 16%, 12%, 10%, 10%. Management reserves the right to adjust the prize money of any class at any time. No prize money will be paid to classes that are run with fewer than 3 entries. Jumper classics require a minimum of 6 entries to be held or they will be combined or canceled, and may be run with no prize money.

All horses that are competing in classes which require USHJA registration which are not microchipped will be ineligible to compete in Federation licensed competitions, Exceptions: USHJA Outreach and those activities enumerated in GR901.9, items 1-9.

SAFE SPORT VERIFICATION: As of January 1, 2019 all USEF members 18-years-old and older, with a Competing Membership, must complete SafeSport Training in order to be eligible to participate in USEF activities, including competitions. Those who do not complete the training will be ineligible to participate in USEF activities, including competitions.

JUDGING FOR ALL HUNTER SECTIONS: To be judged on performance and soundness, suitability to count.

ELIGIBILITY FOR ADULT AMATEURS: HUNTER, JUMPER AND EQUITATION:

To be ridden by exhibitors who have reached their 18th birthday as of December 1 of the current competition year and who hold a current USEF Amateur certification. Open to horses and ponies.

ELIGIBILITY FOR CHILDREN'S SECTIONS: HUNTER, JUMPER AND EQUITATION:

To be ridden by exhibitors who have not reached their 18th birthday as of December 1 of the current competition year.

ADULT AMATEUR HUNTER Sections offered and requirements:

Adult Amateurs – may be split into three (3) sections. **Cross Entry: Riders:** Riders may not cross enter into any Green Hunter 3'6", Green Hunter 3'9" or High Performance Hunter class at the same competition. Exception - under saddle classes. Adult Amateur Riders may not cross enter into any class at the same competition with fences exceeding 3'3" except Jumper Classes not exceeding 1.25m, Equitation and Medal Classes, and the USHJA National Hunter Derby. LOW CHILDREN'S HUNTER HORSE Eligibility:

Open to exhibitors who have not yet reached their 18th birthday as of December 1 of the current competition year. **Cross Entry: Riders:** Riders may not cross enter at the same competition into any class/section where fences exceed 3'0" **Fence Height:** 2'6" **Combining/Dividing Sections:** If there are fewer than three (3) horses entered in the Low Children's Hunter Horse section, then they may be combined and judged with the Children's Hunter Ponies or the Low Adult Amateur Hunter section. New Jumper Chapter Rules Effective Dec 1st for the 2024 Competition Year

JP102 Horse Welfare

2. Conduct outside of the competition ring: Any action(s) against a horse by an exhibitor, deemed excessive by a judge, Federation Steward, Certified Schooling Supervisor or Competition Veterinarian anywhere on the competition grounds may be punished by official warning or elimination from the class. Such action(s) could include, but are not limited to: excessive or improper use of the whip, spurs, reins, rider's weight or rider's hands; lunging a visibly exhausted horse; lunging an obviously lame horse; chasing a horse with a lunge whip or other inappropriate use of the whip; the use of a lunge whip with any type of appendage or attachment, including but not limited to bags and flags; excessive and/or disruptive cracking of the whip. In addition, after consultation with the Competition Manager and a Competition Steward, additional penalties, including one or more of the following: the issuance of an official warning card, disqualification from competing within the upcoming 24-hour period, or disqualification from the balance of the competition. All such violations must be recorded in the Steward's Report.

JP103 Schooling

2. Schooling Supervision Requirements

- An individual with a C1 Steward or Certified Schooling Supervisor license must be present in the schooling area during any Jumper class offering \$10,000 to \$24,999 in prize money. See GR1041 for conflict of interest restrictions.
- An individual with a "R" C1 Steward or Certified Schooling Supervisor license must be appointed to supervise schooling before and during the classes offering \$25,000 or more in prize money. See GR1041 for conflict of interest restrictions.
- The minimum number of required competition Steward(s) must always remain available to attend to other stewarding duties. (See GR1211.4 and GR1041)

JP111 Tack and Attire

5. The total maximum weight of equipment allowed to be added to a Horse's leg, front or hind (single or multiple boots, fetlock rings, etc.), is 500 grams or 17.637 ounces (shoe excluded). Failure to comply with this paragraph will incur disqualification.
- See JP 117.2 for Classes Restricted by Age of Horse.

b. For classes to be included in the USEF Ranking List, the following will also apply to hind boots. Fasteners may only be Velcro, stud type, or hook type. No mechanism that allows the fastener to double back on itself or any kind of leverage to be applied to the fastener is permitted. No additional elements may be added to or inserted in the boot itself. The inside of the boot must be non-abrasive and smooth, that is, the surface must be even and there may not be any pressure points on the inside of the boot. Sheepskin linings are allowed.

JP117 Sections/Classes Restricted by Age of Horse

7. Restrictions. See also specific restrictions in each age category above. Horses competing in Five, Six, or Seven Year Old jumper classes are restricted from cross entering into any class at the same competition that is more than 10 centimeters higher than their respective age group's maximum height. For example, if a horse is jumping in a Five Year Old Jumper class at 1.20m (after July 1st), they may enter classes up to 1.30m, but not higher.

- f. Table II Sec.2(e)—Time first jump-off with designated number of competitors to jump-off. The first round is decided by adding together the faults incurred over the course and any penalties for exceeding the Time Allowed, if any. Following the first round a pre-determined number of competitors based on faults and time will compete in one timed jump-off round in which time will decide in the event of equality of total faults from both rounds. One of the following options must be used:

1. The pre-determined number must be from 6 to 16 but in no case more than the number of places to be awarded, the exact number to be indicated in the prize list (exception: all clear rounds return). The order of go for the jump-off round will be reverse order of scores (faults and time) from the first round. Adjustment of this order, in the case of one rider qualifying multiple horses, may be allowed at management's discretion.
2. The pre-determined number must be from 6 to 16 but in no case more than the number of places to be awarded, the exact number to be indicated in the prize list. Those tied for the final predetermined number, including clear rounds, will be determined by their time in the first round. The order of go for the jump-off round will be reverse order of scores (faults and time) from the first round. Adjustment of this order, in the case of one rider qualifying multiple horses, may be allowed at management's discretion.
