

OUTREACH CLASSES

The following classes are part of the 2025 USHJA Outreach Program. USEF and USHJA membership is not required to participate in an Outreach Competition or in any Outreach classes. Non-USEF and USHJA members will NOT be charged a Non-Member or Show Pass Fee. Riders and Trainers must be USHJA members at the free Outreach level or higher in order to be eligible for points toward year end awards. Hunter championships will be presented in each hunter section with the top four over fences earning under saddle points. Equitation championships will be presented in each equitation section with points counting equally for all classes. Combined section championships will be presented in each combined section with points counting equally for all classes. Ties broken by the most points over fences; if still tied, then most points in the equitation flat class.

Outreach class. To be eligible, horses must have competed in at least two classes over fences in any 2'6" or 2'9" sections at the same show. Riders may not have shown over 3'0" or in the USHJA National Hunter Derby at the same show. Riders may show multiple horses in this class. Open to junior and amateur riders only. Horse and rider combinations to jump a Classic round consisting of 5-6 fences. Directly after the completion of the Classic round, horses will pick up their pace and pass through a set of markers to begin the Handy portion of the class. The Handy round will consist of 4-5 fences, where pace, brilliance, and a shorter track are to be rewarded. Option fences may be used in either round, at the course designer's discretion. This class will be judged by one judge giving one score. Formal attire is requested, but not required.

Entry Fee: \$75 Outreach class. To be eligible, horses must have competed in at least two classes over fences in any of the Outreach sections at the same show. Riders may not have shown over 2'9" or in the USHJA National Hunter Derby at the same show. Riders may show multiple horses in this class. Open to junior and amateur riders only. Horse and rider combinations to jump a Classic round consisting of 5-6 fences. Directly after the completion of the Classic round, horses will pick up their pace and pass through a set of markers to begin the Handy portion of the class. The Handy round will consist of 4-5 fences, where pace, brilliance, and a shorter track are to be rewarded. Option fences may be used in either round, at the course designer's discretion. Two scores will be given by the judging panel, with one score for the Classic round, and one score for the Handy round. The scores will be added together to determine the total score and placement. In the case of a tie, the Handy score will be designated as the tie breaker. Formal attire is requested, but not required.

Open to riders of all ages. Horses to be shown in Jumper Equitation Tack. Please see EQ 106.5b,c,d,e,f and g. To be shown over an advanced Equitation course of at least ten (10) fences set at 1.0 m in height with a time allowed based on 375 m/minute. The first round to be scored numerically on riding style, technique and accuracy. One (1) point will be deducted for each second over the time allowed and four (4) points will be deducted for each knockdown or refusal. Rider will be eliminated for third (3rd) refusal or fall of horse and/or rider. The top six (6) riders will return for the second round with the lowest score returning first. The second round will consist of eight (8) to ten (10) fences and riders will be judged numerically on smoothness and accuracy in negotiating a time saving track. Any bonus points will be incorporated into the score. There will be no time allowed in the second (2nd) round. The winner will be the rider with the highest combined score after the two (2) rounds.

- Written quiz questions will be sourced from:
 - o USEF Rule Book
 - o US Pony Club Handbook
 - o USHJA Trainer Certification Handbook
 - o General Horsemanship Experience and Knowledge
- Written Quiz will be 10-25 questions, tailored for each level. It will be provided from the SCHSA Booth or provided immediately following the corresponding medal class.
- Champion and Reserve Champion awarded at each level.
- Derby Class Points will count towards year-end SCHSA Derby Division Awards

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SCHSA MEDAL FINALS

Open to members who have qualified by competing in a qualifying Medal Class since the 2024 Finals

The Medal Finals in each division will consist of two phases: one round over fences, and a flat phase. The same equipment and horse must be used in both phases, except that martingales may not be used in the flat phase. The martingale may be replaced for an over fences work off. Riders must be the correct age for their division as of the date of the medal finals to be eligible to compete. Riders will draw for their order of go. It is recommended that the Flat Phase be divided into 2 or 3 sections for the convenience of viewing and scoring by the Judges. Riders that have drawn early in the Order Of Go will show in the first flat phase, followed by the group of riders who have drawn next, and so on. Judges will sit together for the flat phase giving each rider a combined score. The judges will sit together for the over fences phase, but give two separate scores with their scores being announced after each rider. The judges scores will be averaged and multiplied by 60% for the over fences and 40% for the flat. A minimum of four riders, as well as any rider within three points of the leader will be called back for a work off and will be judged by both judges sitting together. Scores from the over fences round and the flat phase will be added together and carried over to determine the work-off order, which will be Judges' reverse order of preference. Final placings will be at the sole discretion of the Judges, and work-off scores will not be announced.

601. SCHSA 2'6" JUNIOR HORSEMANSHIP FINAL

Fences will be set at 2'6" and there will be no combinations on course.

602. SCHSA 2'6" AMATEUR HORSEMANSHIP FINAL

Fences will be set a 2'6" and there will be no combinations on course.

600. SCHSA FUTURES MEDAL FINAL 2'3"

The Futures Medal Finals will consist of two rounds over fences and a work off of the top four riders plus any rider within 3 points of the leader. Open numerical scoring will be used. Scores from the first two rounds will be averaged. Order will be drawn for the first round, with riders showing in reverse order scores for the second. All riders will show in both rounds. Judges will give separate scores, but may sit together for the first two rounds, and give one score for the work off. Fences will be set at two foot three inches (2'3"). There will be no combinations on course. USEF tests 1-8. Riders will not be asked to ride without stirrups.



These competitions are governed and approved by the United States Equestrian Federation. Every class offered herein which is covered by the rules and specifications of the current USEF Rule Book will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith. To the extent there is a conflict between the prize list and the USEF rules, USEF rules will prevail. Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above and Combined DrivingCompetitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A non-member may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, or agent, at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

REMINDER: All USEF Life and Senior Active members, as well as participants who have regular contact with minor athletes, are required to comply with the U.S. Center for SafeSport training requirement to be eligible to participate in the competition. All participants must adhere to the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code, USEF Safe Sport Policy, and the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies. More information about these can be found at www.usef.org.

FEDERATION ENTRY AGREEMENT: By entering a Federation-licensed Competition and signing this entry blank as the Owner, Lessee, Trainer, Manager, Agent, Coach, Driver, Rider, Handler, Vaulter or Longeur and on behalf of myself and my principals, representatives, employees and agents, I agree that I am subject to the Bylaws and Rules of the United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (the "Federation") and the local rules of Competition. I agree to be bound by the Bylaws and Rules of the Federation and of the competition. I will accept as final the decision of the Hearing Committee on any question arising under the Rules, and agree to release and hold harmless the competition, the Federation, their officials, directors and employees for any action taken under the Rules. I represent that I am eligible to enter and/or participate under the Rules, and every horse I am entering is eligible as entered. I also agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry, the Federation and/or the Competition may use or assign photographs, videos, audios, cable -casts, broadcasts, internet, film, new media or other likenesses of me and my horse taken during the course of the competition for the promotion, coverage or benefit of the competition, sport, or the Federation. Those likenesses shall not be used to advertise a product and they may not be used in such a way as to jeopardize amateur status. I hereby expressly and irrevocably waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to compensation, invasion of privacy, right of publicity, or to misappropriation. The construction and application of Federation rules are governed by the laws of the State of New York, and any action instituted against the Federation must be filed in New York State. See GR908.4. If not currently a USEF Active Competing member or Subscriber, I acknowledge that I will be enrolled for no cost as a USEF Fan and my USEF Fan Account will continue to annually automatically renew in USEF's sole discretion. Additionally, I acknowledge that the benefits of a USEF Fan are subject to change without notice. USEF may in its sole discretion, at any time, terminate my USEF Fan status. I acknowledge that I may opt out at any time by going to My USEF Dashboard or calling (859) 810-8733.

USEF WAIVER AND RELEASE OF LIABILITY, ASSUMPTION OF RISK AND INDEMNITY AGREEMENT: Effective immediately, all individuals on the property will be required to sign the USEF Waiver and Release of Liability, Assumption of Risk and Indemnity Agreement. The Agreement will be available on our website (www. westpalmsevents.com) and can be executed and signed electronically.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY: Every horse entered for competition will be under the control of the Horse Show Management, but Horse Show Management will, in no case, be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur, and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall defend, indemnify and hold harmless the Horse Show and its officials, employees, directors, officers, West Palms Event Management, ASM Incorporated, City of Los Angeles and its Sponsors, etc for any loss or accident to his horse, horses, employees or equipment which may occur from sickness, fire or other cause.

MANAGEMENT: Horse Show Management reserves the right to interpret all questions and conditions in regard to or arising out of an incident to the show without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. All questions not covered in these Rules and Regulations shall be decided by Horse Show Management-their decision to be final. Horse Show Management reserves the right to refuse, accept conditionally or to cancel any entries, disqualify riders or exhibitors, prohibit exhibition of entries and cancel award prizes, without claim for damages; to change any course, to cancel or combine any unfilled classes, or to reschedule classes, after due notice to exhibitors; to change rings or rotate or change judges and officials; to change specifications in jumper classes in order to facilitate the time schedule. Management reserves the right to combine or cancel. Management reserves the right to limit entries in a class. Refused entries will be returned.

ASSUMPTION OF RISK: By signing the entry blank, the Owner, Lessee, Trainer, Manager, Agent, Coach, Driver, Rider, Handler, Vaulter or Loungeur acknowledges that horseback riding, particularly jumping, is a dangerous activity and involves inherent risks that may cause serious injury and in some cases death because of the unpredictable nature and irrational behavior of horses, regardless of their training and past performance and expressly assumes all such inherent risks whether identified herein, in the entry blank, or in the Federation Rules and Regulations. A horse, without warning or any apparent cause, can buck, stumble. fall, rear, bite, kick, run, make unpredictable movements, spook, jump obstacles, step on a person's foot or push a person-all of which may cause the rider or observer to fall or be jolted, resulting in serious injury or death. A horse may also become loose and cause injury to an observer or rider or to another horse-a loose horse can run at full gallop in a panic and run into objects or persons or other horses. The Show Ground Facilities are bordered by highways/roads and thus noise from traffic and other sources occurs that can and will cause a horse to unexpectedly spook or react quickly. The Show Ground Facilities contain roads or driveways that are traversed by cars, golf carts, tractors, trailers and heavy equipment all of which may spook a horse. The above warnings and risks are meant as an example of some of the risks that are inherent and may be encountered but it is agreed this is not an exhaustive list and there are numerous additional conditions and/or events that may result in injuries while participating in the Competition and/or being present on the Show Ground Facility.

DAMAGE: Owners and exhibitors shall be held responsible for damage caused by them, their agents or employees to stalls, buildings and other properties on the show grounds, and shall be billed accordingly.

ADHERENCE TO THE RULES: All individuals on the horse park property are required to adhere to the rules mentioned in the prize list or as directed by the employees at the horse park. Trainers are all responsible for employees adhering to the rules. Violations will result in expulsion from the horse park.

THE FOLLOWING IS REQUIRED FOR EACH ENTRY:

- A. All horses on grounds must be registered on an entry blank including horses not entered in classes. One entry blank per horse.
- B. Entry forms must be complete with owner, riders, trainers and payee information including association membership numbers.
- C. Date of Birth of all minor exhibitors.

- D. Signatures of owner, riders, trainer and parent or guardian of minor exhibitors. Parents or guardians of minor exhibitors shall hold the Horse Show, West Palms Event Management, Inc., ASM Incorporated, City of Los Angeles and staff harmless for injury to such minor(s).
- E. Entries must be submitted electronically through showgroundslive.com.
- F. For all horses include Nomination and Stall Fees as a deposit. Make checks payable to WPEM or complete the credit card information through your showgroundslive account.

Accounts must be closed at the end of each show week. Management will close Exhibitor Accounts that have not been settled at the conclusion of each show. Back numbers will not be issued until previous week balances are closed. Exhibitors must close out their account online through ShowGroundsLive. Exhibitors who do not close out by the Monday following each show automatically authorize WPEM to close their account using the Credit Card on file. Billing questions or refunds will not be considered after two weeks following the conclusion of the show. Should you have any questions or concerns with your bill, please email the horse show office directly. The Horse Show policies herein stated regarding scratches and refunds will be followed regardless of weather and in place of GR 912. Receipt of any entry form to WPEM, whether bearing signature or not, will constitute an entry and will be subject to the Rules and Regulations of this prize list.

PAYMENT: An open check or credit card is required at time of check in before numbers will be issued. See 6F for deposit information. A 3% surcharge will be applied to all credit card transactions and is nonrefundable once the card has been processed.

REFUNDS: Request for a refund of the deposit must be in writing and received before the closing date of entries and a \$35.00 fee will be deducted. The nomination and stall fees are not refundable under any condition after the close of entries. Credit Card fees are nonrefundable at any time after the card has been processed.

POST ENTRIES: Entries received with payment after entries are due will pay a \$100.00 late fee per show.

TRAINER SPLITS: WPEM allows trainers to split the show charges for miscellaneous items to their clients. Splits will be accepted until noon on the Friday of a show week. No exceptions will be made. Only items billed by the horse show directly can be split. Splits will revert back to the trainer for payment if uncollected.

ADDS/SCRATCHES: All adds must be made by 4:00 pm the day prior to each class. No entries will be accepted for a class scheduled on the same day. In the unusual case the time schedule allows a management approved add the day of a class, the entry fee will be double. Horses and riders who go in a class without entering will pay a fee of \$50.00. All scratches must be received in the show office before the start of the class in writing to be considered for a refund; scratches via phone call or at the gate will NOT be considered. In divisions that are entered by complete section, no refund will be considered if the horse shows in any class of the division. The only other refunds given will be for cancellation of a class by Management, overpayment of fees, or the rejection of entries because of ineligibility or lack of stall space.

RAIN: In the event of rain prior to the Show, it is the riders' responsibility to call Show Management to determine whether the show is canceled.

RESPONSIBILITY OF PAYMENT OF SERVICES AND SUPPLIES: All owners and exhibitors will be held responsible for any damage incurred by them,

their animals, agents, or employees, to stalls, buildings and other properties on the Show grounds and shall be billed accordingly. All bills for veterinary, farrier services and feed/bedding are due and payable during the Show. Management reserves the right to deduct any unpaid veterinary, farrier and feed/bedding bills from premium money due the exhibitor. Any exhibitor not meeting his obligations to the official Show Veterinarian, farrier and feed/bedding vendor will be termed an undesirable exhibitor and entries from that exhibitor may not be accepted at subsequent shows.

RETURNED CHECKS/CHARGEBACKS: Checks returned by the bank or Credit card chargebacks for any reason are regarded as a most serious offense and will be handled according to the following procedure: A \$50 penalty will be assessed for each returned check or chargeback OR 10% of the face value of the check or chargeback, whichever is greater. Accounts will be given ten (10) days to be paid in full with cash or cash equivalent or they will be reported to the U.S. Equestrian Federation, Inc., PCHA and other appropriate association(s) for further disciplinary action. Checks will not be deposited a second time. In the case that the debt is not cleared within 30 days of the conclusion of the show, all prize money will be forfeited.

UNPAID CHARGES: Any exhibitor leaving the show with an unpaid balance will be billed for these charges and a \$50 billing fee will be added to the total due. Until these charges are settled, all further entries of rider and owner will be returned.

SAFETY REGULATIONS: Unauthorized use of the light fixtures will result in removal of your appliance. Smoking or open flame devices are not permitted within the stables. Keep flammable decorations to a minimum. Electrical outlets are provided.

CLOSED RINGS: Horses are not permitted in any ring where a course is set unless otherwise given permission from management, or when there is equipment in the ring. Please check with the show office for information regarding schooling policies. Horses and riders must yield immediately for watering and dragging. Violations of the above mentioned rules may be considered cause for elimination from the show.

RING INFORMATION: All warm up and competitions arenas contain either geotextile or sand footing. Dimensions are: **Los Angeles Equestrian Center:** Hap Hansen Arena-150' x 300', Equidome-150' x 300', East Ring-135' x 285', Allen Arena East & West-150' x 300'

STABLING: Permanent stalls and tack rooms will be available for \$425.00 at LA Summer Classic, 10' x 10' with top and bottom doors and dirt flooring. Horse stalls for Registered Thoroughbred horses competing at the shows are available for \$200.00. Only shavings will be permitted for bedding of stalls. Exhibitors may be assessed a disposal fee for anything other than shavings. However, we cannot guarantee stabling for post entries, and we recommend that your entries be received before the closing date. The show office handles all stall transactions and charges. Private transactions involving stalls are not permitted. Management reserves the right to limit tack stalls. Hauling in is allowed and is \$100 per day per horse. All horses entered must either purchase a show stall or board at the facility. Stall fees are not refundable after the entry due date. IF YOU LEAVE ANYTHING BEHIND IN THE STABLE AREA, YOU WILL BE BILLED A MINIMUM OF \$500. IF YOU LEAVE SYRINGES ANYWHERE OTHER THAN THE RECEPTACLES PROVIDED YOU WILL BE BILLED \$500 PER SYRINGE.THIS WILL BE STRICTLY ENFORCED.

Curfew and quiet times must be observed between 9pm and 5am (as required by GR1215.3 #033-22)

HORSE IDENTIFICATION: Horses are now required to have a back number attached to their neck or their rider when outside of their barn/tent (as per HJ106.2 #247-22).

ROLEX/USEF RANKING LIST: Please visit ryegate.com/uset.php Upcoming Classes to determine which classes will be included in the Rolex Computer Ranking List.

FEED AND BEDDING: Pre-orders and onsite orders must be submitted through www.westpalmsevents.com. (online order) Orders must be made by NOON. each day for same-day delivery through the website.

TIES: In all jumper classes, ties involving first place will be jumped off. All other ties will be determined by time taken to complete the first round.

SCHOOLING SUPERVISION: Gate Stewards are schooling supervisors and have absolute authority to scratch riders who do not follow USEF, FEI or appropriate association schooling rules.

NUMBERS: Management will provide a number card for each competitor which shall be worn clearly visible to the judge at all times when in competition. Riders wearing the wrong number or no number at all MAY be eliminated from the class by the judges.

DOGS: Dogs and other pets must be confined to the Stable Area. Dogs must be on a leash at all times. Stray dogs and dogs in violation will be impounded by Animal Control authorities. Under no circumstances are dogs allowed at the arenas.

VACCINATION INFORMATION: Beginning December 1, 2015, all horses entering the grounds of a Federation-licensed competition must be accompanied by documentation of Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhinopneumonitis) vaccinations within six months prior to entering the stables. The management in consultation with respected veterinarians and local animal health authorities strongly recommend and urge that all horses attending the show follow a two-part West Nile vaccination protocol consisting of a primary vaccination, followed by a booster 3-6 weeks later. Should you have any questions please contact the CDFA. Please refer to the www.westpalmsevents.com and the show office for current Equine Health and Biosecurity measures.

EQUINE HEALTH REQUIREMENTS: Equine Health Requirements will be enforced. All horses (competing or not) that enter the grounds are required to present the Required Health Entry Requirements, including the Event Participation Declaration and Proof of Vaccination. All horses are subject to examination by WPEM officials/designated representatives and/or state officials (collectively "officials") for determining whether such animals are, have been infected/exposed, or are likely to become infected with an infectious or contagious disease. If after such examination, officials have reason to believe that an animal's health condition places other animals at risk, such officials, at their sole discretion, may quarantine such animal (and others that may have been infected/exposed) or, if appropriate, require that such animals be transported off the grounds. All participants agree to fully cooperate with event officials and abide by their decisions and instructions. Failure to comply shall be grounds for immediate expulsion and potential disciplinary action by organization, state/local or federal animal health officials. All exhibitors are encouraged to review the equine health entry/transport requirements of the destination state prior to entry. Additional information can be obtained from the State Vet Office. Please refer to the www.westpalmsevents.com and the show office for current Equine Health and Biosecurity measures.

ARRIVAL AND DEPARTURE: Stalls will be available at 10:00 on Tuesday, August 12. All stalls must be vacated by Sunday, August 17.

PROTEST: Any USEF member lodging a protest must first deposit \$200 (nonmembers \$300) payable to West Palms Event Management with the Show Secretary, which sum shall be forfeited to the Horse Show, if same is not sustained. All protests must be in writing, signed by the protester and filed within 48 hours of the occurrence of the alleged violation. A protest may be filed with the Show Manager, the Federation Hearing committee or Show Secretary. If the protest is sustained, the entries standing next in award shall be moved up accordingly. See USEF GR603 and GR603.1.

HELMET RULE: It is compulsory for all persons at Federation licensed hunter, jumper or hunter/jumper competitions when mounted anywhere on the competition grounds, to wear properly fastened protective headgear which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/ SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. It must be properly fitted with harness secured. Exception: In Hunter or Jumper classes, adults may be allowed to remove their headgear while accepting prizes and during the playing of the National Anthem only; they must refasten their headgear prior to the lap of honor. It is compulsory for riders in Paso Fino classes, both open and breed restricted including Hunter Hack, where jumping is required and when jumping anywhere on the competition grounds to wear properly fastened protective headgear which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. It must be properly fitted with harness secured. A Show Committee, Competition Management, and Licensed Officials must bar riders without protective headgear from entering the ring for classes in which protective headgear is required and may bar any entry or person from entering the ring if not suitably presented to appear before an audience.

DRUG TESTING: State of California drug testing rules apply. For a copy contact the Show Office.

GOLF CARTS AND BICYCLES: Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule. The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hoverboards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

PARKING: Parking allowed in designated areas only. Violators parked in NO PARKING ZONES and FIRE LANES will be issued citations and/or towed from the premises at the owner's expense. There are Handicap parking

areas in the Stable Area and public parking lot.

WASHING HORSES: Nozzles are required on all hoses to help conserve water.

STALL CLEANING: Please deposit all manure at the ends of the barn aisles and NOT in the middle or in front of the stalls. If excessive cleanup is required after departure from the show, there will be a \$500 fee charged. Trainers are encouraged to supervise their staff to avoid this fee.

TURNOUTS AND LUNGING: Horses may not be turned-out in arenas at any time. Lunging in designated areas only.

MEDICAL WASTE: All needles and syringes MUST be deposited in designated disposal containers and not left in stalls or thrown in trash receptacles. Violators will be fined \$75 per needle/syringe. For the first offense the trainer/owner will be notified as well as the appropriate association. The second offense will disqualify the individual and horse and they will be banished from the show with NO REFUND.

POLING: Poling is prohibited in the State of California. No bamboo or offsets allowed on the Show ground's. Non-compliance will result in elimination from the show.

ORDER OF GO: There will be a posted order of go in all classes that will be computer generated unless otherwise stated. All jumper classes will run in strict posted order. Any anticipated scheduling conflicts should be brought to the attention of the starters who will advise you on how it will be resolved. Under no circumstances will the Horse Show be interrupted due to a competitor failing to present himself at the gate in a timely manner. Multiple rides must be shown in the correct order. Failure to do so will result in elimination. In hunter classes with double rounds, a posted order will be observed with a rotation of three rounds unless otherwise posted.

AWARDS PRESENTATIONS: In all classes, an awards presentation will be made. Riders should be present to accept these awards. A suitable horse should be available for classes where it is required to ride for awards. Riders failing to present themselves for awards presentations will forfeit all prize money. Trophy to First Place, Ribbons through eighth place in all classes, except where otherwise noted.

PRIZE MONEY: Prize Money Payout: In order to have prize money applied to entry's account and or have a check sent within 30 days of the competition closing, the prize money recipient must provide within 30 days: a social security number, federal tax id number or tax identification number to the show secretary by Sunday of the current competition. NO PRIZE MONEY WILL BE DEDUCTED/ PAID/MAILED UNLESS THE PRIZE MONEY RECIPIENTS SOCIAL SECURITY/ FEDERAL TAX ID NUMBER/ TAX ID NUMBER IS PROVIDED TO THE SHOW SECRETARY WITHIN 30 DAYS FROM THE COMPLETION OF THE SHOW. The Internal Revenue Service requires 30% of prize money won by foreign exhibitors to be withheld.

Foreign exhibitors should apply for a U.S. Social Security number and are required to complete a W-8 Certificate of Foreign Status Form. Unless otherwise stated, prize money will be distributed through 6th place as follows- 30%, 22%, 16%, 12%, 10%, 10%. Management reserves the right to adjust the prize money of any class at any time. No prize money will be paid to classes that are run with fewer than 3 entries. Jumper classics require a minimum of 6 entries to be held or they will be combined or canceled, and may be run with no prize money.

The minimum amount of guaranteed hunter prize money payout for 2025 is \$5,000.

CHAMPION AND RESERVE CHAMPION AWARDS: Champion and Reserve will be awarded in all divisions with 3 classes that fill.

INSURANCE: All owners and competitors are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents, or their animals. They are therefore strongly advised to take out third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date.

FOOD: Food will be served in the food court.

ATTIRE: Proper attire is required in all hunter, equitation rings during competition as well as Jumper classes with \$1,000 or more in prize money. Proper Attire is requested for all other jumper classes.

NON-SHOWING HORSES: Non-Showing horses are not allowed in the show areas.

SUBSTITUTIONS: Substitution of horses are allowed with the same owner.

NON SMOKING EVENT: The events included in this prize list are non smoking events in accordance with California State Law SB-977 Tobacco: youth sports events.

MICROCHIP VERIFICATION: All horses competing in classes that require USHJA horse registration must provide a microchip number that verifies their animal's identity in order to compete for points, money won or be eligible for Federation and/or USHJA programs and awards where horses are required to be recorded or registered. A microchip used to verify identity must be a fifteen-digit ISO compliant 11784/11785 chip and be implanted in the nuchal ligament of the animal. All horses that are competing in classes which require USHJA registration which are not microchipped will be ineligible to compete in Federation licensed competitions, Exceptions: USHJA Outreach and those activities enumerated in GR901.9, items 1-9.

SAFE SPORT VERIFICATION: As of January 1, 2019 all USEF members 18-years-old and older, with a Competing Membership, must complete SafeSport Training in order to be eligible to participate in USEF activities, including competitions. Please see the USEF website at https://www.usef.org/compete/resources-forms/rulesregulations/safe-sport for more information. Those who do not complete the training will be ineligible to participate in USEF activities, including competitions.

ELIGIBILITY FOR ADULT AMATEURS: HUNTER, JUMPER AND EQUITATION: To be ridden by exhibitors who have reached their 18th birthday as of December 1 of the current competition year and who hold a current USEF Amateur certification. Open to horses and ponies.

ELIGIBILITY FOR CHILDREN'S SECTIONS: HUNTER, JUMPER AND EQUITATION: To be ridden by exhibitors who have not reached their 18th birthday as of December 1 of the current competition year.

ADULT AMATEUR HUNTER Sections offered and requirements: Adult Amateurs - may be split into three (3) sections. Cross Entry: Riders: Riders may not cross enter into any Green Hunter 3'6", Green Hunter 3'9" or High Performance Hunter class at the same competition. Exception - under saddle classes. Adult Amateur Riders may not cross enter into any class at the same competition with fences exceeding 3'3" except Jumper Classes not exceeding 1.25m, Equitation and Medal Classes, and the USHJA National Hunter Derby. Riders may cross enter between the Adult Amateur Hunter and the Amateur Owner section if the rider owns the horse he or she is showing in the Adult Amateur section. The Low Adult Amateur Hunter Horse section may only be combined with the Children's Hunter Pony and Low Children's Hunter Horse sections after those sections have been combined and still do not meet the three (3) entry minimum. Rider: Any competitor that competes in any class set at over 1.25 m is ineligible to compete in an Amateur Jumper class set below 1.20 m at that competition. Horse/

Pony: n/a. Horse and Rider Combination: n/a. Fence Height: Amateur Jumper 1.00m to 1.05m. Amateur Jumper 1.10m for the first class of the section. In all other classes of the section fences to be set no lower than 1.10m and no higher than 1.15m. Combining/Dividing Sections: 1.00/1.05m Junior's and 1.00/1.05m Amateur Jumper sections must combine if there are fewer than three (3) in either section and may combine if there are fewer than six (6) in either section. Horse and rider combination: No cross entry restrictions at one-day competitions. Classics: Three (3) entries are required to conduct a Hunter Classic. Fence Height: 3'0" with spreads not to exceed fence height. In and outs are permitted. Distances will not be adjusted for ponies. Combining/Dividing Sections: If there are fewer than three (3) entries, the Children's Hunter section may be combined with the Adult Amateur Hunter section. Awards: Zone Horse of the Year Awards will be presented annually to the following sections: Children's Hunter Horse.

LOW CHILDREN'S HUNTER HORSE Eligibility: Open to exhibitors who have not yet reached their 18th birthday as of December 1 of the current competition year. Cross Entry: Riders: Riders may not cross enter at the same competition into any class/section where fences exceed 3'0" Fence Height: 2'6" Combining/Dividing Sections: If there are fewer than three (3) horses entered in the Low Children's Hunter Horse section, then they may be combined and judged with the Children's Hunter Ponies or the Low Adult Amateur Hunter section. If there are still fewer than three (3) entries after the Children's Hunter Pony section has been combined with the Low Children's Hunter Horse section, these sections may only then

combine with the Low Adult Amateur Hunter Horse section. **Awards:** Zone Horse of the Year Awards will be presented annually to the following section: Low Children's Hunter Horse.

CHILDREN'S HUNTER PONY Sections offered and requirements: Small/Medium Children's Pony, Large Children's Pony. Cross Entry: Rider: Rider may not cross enter in any division where the fences exceed 3'3" (exception: Children's Jumper sections). Horse/Pony: n/a. Horse and Rider Combination: n/a. Fence Height: Small/Medium Ponies: 2'0"; spreads not to exceed height of fence. Large Ponies: 2'6"; spreads not to exceed height of fence. In and outs are not permitted. Combining/ Dividing Sections: If there are fewer than three (3) ponies in the Children's Hunter Small/Medium Pony or Children's Hunter Large Pony, then the classes may be combined and judged together. Horse and Rider Combination: n/a. Fence Height: Junior Jumper $1.00 \,\mathrm{m}$ to $1.05 \,\mathrm{m}$. Junior Jumper $1.10 \,\mathrm{m}$ for the first class of the section. In all other classes of the section fences to be set no lower than $1.10 \,\mathrm{m}$ and no higher than $1.15 \,\mathrm{m}$. Conduct outside of the competition ring: Any action(s) against a horse by an exhibitor, deemed excessive by a judge, Federation Steward, Certified Schooling Supervisor or Competition Veterinarian anywhere on the competion grounds may be punished by official warning or elimination from the class. Such action(s) could include, but are not limited to: excessive or improper use of the whip, spurs, reins, rider's weight or rider's hands; lunging a visibly exhausted horse; lunging an obviously lame horse; chasing a horse with a lunge whip or other inappropriate use of the whip; the use of a lunge whip with any type of appendage or atachment, including but not limited to bags and flags; excessive and/or disruptive cracking of the whip. In addition, after consultation with the Competition Manager and a Competition Steward, additional penalties, including one or more of the following: the issuance of an official warning card, disqualification from competing within the upcoming 24-hour period, or disqualification from the balance of the competition. All such violations must be recorded in the Steward's Report.

JP103 Schooling

- 2. Schooling Supervision Requirements
 - a. An individual with a C1 Steward or Certified Schooling Supervisor license must be present in the schooling area during any Jumper class offering \$10,000 to \$24,999 in prize money. See GR1041 for conflict of interest restrictions.
 - b. An individual with a "R" C1 Steward or Certified Schooling Supervisor license must be appointed to supervise schooling before and during the classes offering \$25,000 or more in prize money. See GR1041 for conflict of interest restric ons.
 - c. The minimum number of required competition Steward(s) must always remain available to atend to other stewarding duties. (See GR1211.4 and GR1041)

JP111 Tack and Attire

- 5. The total maximum weight of equipment allowed to be added to a Horse's leg, front or hind (single or multiple boots, fetlock rings, etc.), is 500 grams or 17.637 ounces (shoe excluded). Failure to comply with this paragraph will incur disqualification.
 - a. See JP 117.2 for Classes Restricted by Age of Horse.
 - b. For classes to be included in the USEF Ranking List, the following will also apply to hind boots. Fasteners may only be Velcro, stud type, or hook type. No mechanism that allows the fastener to double back on itself or any kind of leverage to be applied to the fastener is permited. No additional elements may be added to or inserted in the boot itself. The inside of the boot must be non-abrasive and smooth, that is, the surface must be even and there may not be any pressure points on the inside of the boot. Sheepskin linings are allowed.

JP117 Sections/Classes Restricted by Age of Horse

7. Restrictions. See also specific restrictions in each age category above. Horses competing in Five, Six, or Seven Year Old jumper classes are restricted from cross entering into any class at the same competition that is more than 10 centimeters higher than their respective age group's maximum height. For example, if a horse is jumping in a Five Year Old Jumper class at 1.20m (after July 1st), they may enter classes up to 1.30m, but not higher.

 - 4. 1.10/1.15m Amateur classes will have courses set at 1.10m (3'7") to 1.15m (3'9"). All Amateur classes set at 1.10m to 1.15m will be pointed towards the 1.10/1.15m Amateur category for the purposes of HOTY awards. These specifications will apply unless addressed by specific USHJA Zone specifications (available at www.ushja.org).
 - 5. 1.00/1.05m Amateur classes will have course set at 1.00m (3'3") to 1.05m (3'5"). All Amateur classes set at 1.00m to 1.05m will be pointed towards the 1.00/1.05m Amateur category for the purposes of HOTY awards. These specifications will apply unless addressed by specific USHJA Zone specifications (available at www.ushja.org).
- 2. Junior Jumper:
 - c. Level of Difficulty.
 - 1. 1.40/1.45m Junior classes will have courses set at 1.40m (4'7") to 1.45 m (4'9'). The maximum height for the first class of this section, and for any classes in which time is the deciding factor in the initial round, is 1.40 m (4'7").

All Junior classes set at 1.40m to 1.45 m will be pointed towards the 1.40/1.45m Junior Jumper category for the purposes of HOTY awards.

- 1.30/1.35m Junior classes will have courses set at 1.30 m (4'3") to 1.35 m (4'5"). All Junior classes set at 1.30 m to 1.35 m will be pointed towards the 1.30/1.35m Junior Jumper category for the purposes of HOTY awards.
- 3. 1.20/1/25m Junior sections will have courses set at 1.20m (3'11") to 1.25m (4'1"). All Junior Jumper classes at 1.20m to 1.25m will be pointed towards the 1.20/1.25m Junior Jumper category for the purposes of HOTY awards.
- 4. 1.10/1.15m Junior classes will have courses set at 1.10m (3'7") to 1.15m (3'9"). All Junior classes set at 1.10m to 1.15m will be pointed towards the 1.10/1.15m Junior category for the purposes of HOTY awards. These specifications will apply unless addressed by specific USHJA Zone specifications (available at www.ushja.org).
- 5. 1.00/1.05m Junior classes will have course set at 1.00m (3'3") to 1.05m (3'5"). All Junior classes set at 1.00m to 1.05m will be pointed towards the 1.00/1.05m Junior category for the purposes of HOTY awards. These specifications will apply unless addressed by specific USHJA Zone specifications (available at www.ushja.org).

- 3. Time first jump-off
 - f. Table II Sec.2(e)—Time first jump-off with designated number of competitors to jump-off. The first round is decided by

- adding together the faults incurred over the course and any penalties for exceeding the Time Allowed, if any. Following the first round a pre-determined number of competitors based on faults and time will compete in one timed jump-off round in which time will decide in the event of equality of total faults from both rounds. One of the following options must be used:
- 1. The pre-determined number must be from 6 to 16 but in no case more than the number of places to be awarded, the exact number to be indicated in the prize list (exception: all clear rounds return). The order of go for the jump-off round will be reverse order of scores (faults and time) from the first round. Adjustment of this order, in the case of one rider qualifying multiple horses, may be allowed at management's discretion.
- 2. The pre-determined number must be from 6 to 16 but in no case more than the number of places to be awarded, the exact number to be indicated in the prize list. Those tied for the final predetermined number, including clear rounds, will be determined by their time in the first round. The order of go for the jump-off round will be reverse order of scores (faults and time) from the first round. Adjustment of this order, in the case of one rider qualifying multiple horses, may be allowed at management's discretion.

APPENDIX A USEF JUMPER SCHOOLING RULES

4. Obstacles must be flagged and jumped in the proper direction. The Steward and/or Schooling Supervisor will decide if the flags may be interchanged.



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
